## Conference Travel Fellowship

The conference travel fellowship will cover the fellow’s airfare within North America, ground transportation, hotel accommodation, conference registration, and an allowance for meals.

### Eligibility

To be eligible, you must satisfy the following conditions:

1. **Either** you are a candidate for a Ph.D. in Philosophy who is currently registered for this degree **or** you were awarded a Ph.D. in Philosophy during the past three years.
2. You are a member of a group that is under-represented in philosophy who has started or is planning for a faculty career in philosophy.
3. You are a citizen or permanent resident of the U.S.A.

A specialization that includes the conference topic is not required, but applicants should explain how they expect to benefit from attending a conference on this topic.

### Applications
